

Division II - Arrangements Rules

Arrangements Score Card (all classes) **Possible 100 points**

Conformance - 15 points a. Naming of roses b. Conformance to type of design c. Other specific requirements of schedule

Design - 30 Points Balance, dominance, contrast, rhythm, proportion, scale

Perfection of the Rose(s) - 30 points Including condition of other plant material

Creativity and Expressiveness - 15 points

Distinction - 10 Points Unique, sets the design apart, superiority in every respect, includes technical execution/construction.

1. Entries accepted from 6:00 am to 9:30 am. Any arranger in the exhibiting room after last call before judging will be disqualified.
2. Exhibitors must register. Arrangements must be set up & placed by the exhibitor only. Entries must remain until the close of the show.
3. Exhibitor is limited to one entry per class. Each entry must be the exhibitor's own work & not have been displayed in another show.
4. Members of the same household may enter each class as long as they individually create each arrangement.
5. All roses must be outdoor grown, of high quality and be the dominant flower. Roses should be correctly named and listed on the entry tags. The ARS Medal Certificates will only be awarded to arranger grown entries, therefore, all entries with arranger grown roses must be identified as such by placing 'AG' on the upper right corner of the entry tag
6. Unless otherwise stated, accessories are allowed. Bases will be considered part of the arrangement. Accessories and flowers other than roses and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule. The arrangements will be placed on long, open tables. Arrangements may not be moved by anyone except the arranger or the chairman of arrangements.
7. All miniature arrangements must use roses classified by ARS as miniature or mini-flora.
8. Trophies will awarded to the purple ribbon winner of each section and must have a score of 90 or better. ARS Medal Certificates will only be awarded to the best entries to achieve a score of 92 or greater.
9. California Coastal Rose Society will not be held responsible for exhibits. We strongly encourage arrangers to place their name on all accessories not noticeable to the judges. The arranger shall pick up or arrange to have their entries picked up at the end of the show.
10. Trophies will be awarded at 2:00 pm on Saturday, May 1, 2010. Arrangers should be present or make arrangements for someone to pick up their trophies. California Coastal Rose Society cannot be held responsible for unclaimed trophies or arrangements.
11. The Arrangement Division shall be judged according to the rules and procedures outlined in the ARS Guideline for Judging Rose Arrangements. The decisions of the judges are final.
12. Care should be exercised when preparing arrangements in the show area. ALL WATER AND TRASH AROUND YOUR AREA MUST BE CLEANED UP OR DISQUALIFICATION COULD OCCUR.
13. ARS causes for disqualification of an arrangement are:
 - A) Roses are not outdoor grown
 - B) Use of artificial plant material.
14. Penalty: 1. Painted or dyed fresh plant material or use of live creatures are not allowed. 2. Use of plant material on state conservation list not permitted 3. Use of any country flags are not permitted.

Best in Section: ARS Royalty Award and Trophy

Class 1 *Flower Fields* **Mass**

Roses must be dominate flower.

Class 2 *Magee Historical Garden* **Line Mass or Line Mass**

Section B - Modern

Best in Section: ARS Artist Award and Trophy

Class 3 *Carlsbad Library (est. 1956)* **Modern Design including pages, text, book elements. Arranger's Choice**

Class 4 *Carlsbad Mineral Springs (est. 1930)* **Modern Design - Underwaver**

Section C - Oriental Manner

Best in Section: ARS Oriental Award and Trophy

Class 5 *Buena Vista lagoon* **A low container, water must show in the manner of moribana.**

Class 6 *Tamarak Beach* **Using a tall container, in the manner of Nageire**

Class 7 *Carlsbad Triathlon (est. 1981)* **Freestyle in the Oriental manner.**

Section D - Duchess

Best in Section: ARS Duchess of Arrangements Award and Trophy

Class 8 *California (1858) becomes part of the USA.* Roses with dried and/or treated plant material. NO FRESH PLANT MATERIAL EXCEPT ROSES. **Arrangers Choice.** Type of design must be noted on entry tag.

Section E - Duke

Best in Section: ARS Duke of Arrangements Award and Trophy

Class 9 *Army-Navy Academy (est. 1936)* An arrangement greater than 10 inches, but not to exceed 20 inches in height, width or depth. Roses should be appropriate for a small to mediam-size container **Arrangers Choice.** Type of design must be noted on entry tag.

Section F - Novice

Best in Section: ARS Novice Certificate and Trophy

Open only to those who have won no more than 3 first-place arrangement ribbons or a trophy in any ARS show. Design type must be noted on entry tag.

Class 10 *Magee House* **Standard Rose Arrangement**

Class 11 *Twinn Inns* **Miniature Rose Arrangement**
Not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Section G - Miniature Traditional

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Royalty Award and Trophy

Class 12 *California Coastal Rose Society (est. 1988)* **Miniature Mass** Not to exceed 5 inches in height, width or depth. **Arrangers Choice.**

Class 13 *La Costa Resort* **Miniature Line or Line Mass**
Must be greater than 5 inches but not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Section H - Miniature Modern

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Artist Award and Trophy

Class 14 *Lego Land (est. 1999)* **A Modern Design**
Accessories permitted. Not to exceed 10" in height, width or depth.

Section I - Miniature Oriental Manner

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Oriental Award and Trophy

Class 15 *Native Carlsbad - Luisenos Indians (prior 1700)* **A low container, water must show in the manner of moribana.**

Not to exceed 5 inches in height, width or depth.

Class 16 *Native Carlsbad - Dieguenos Indians (prior 1700)* **Freestyle Design** Greater than 5 inches but not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth.

Section J - Miniature Duchess of Arrangements

Using fresh roses with dried and/or treated dried plant material. No Fresh plant material other than roses.

Best in Section: ARS Miniature Duchess Award & Trophy

Class 17 *Carlsbad State Beach* **Arranger's choice**
Not to exceed 10 inches in height, width or depth. Type of design must be noted on entry tag.

Section K - Miniature Princess of Arrangements

Best in Section: ARS Mini Princess of Arrangements Award and Trophy

Class 18 *Elm Street Forever (Carlsbad Village Drive)* **Arranger's choice**
Using roses with rose foliage, hips, canes and roots. Only fresh rose materials may be used. No other plant materials or accessories are permitted

Section L - Judges Arrangements - Arranger's choice (type of design must be noted on entry tag.)

Best in Section: ARS Judges Certificate and Trophy

Class 19 *Surf's Up in Carlsbad* **Standard Arrangement**
Class 20 *Agua Hedionda Lagoon* **Miniature Arrangement**

Any type of rose, individual bloom or spray, no more than one of a variety from the same garden. Vases and tags will be furnished in the judges breakfast area.

The CALIFORNIA COASTAL ROSE SOCIETY meetings are held monthly at Heritage Hall, 2650 Garfield, Carlsbad, CA on the third Tuesday of each month, at 6:15 and 7:00 pm. No meetings are held in July, August and December. Each meeting features a program on a subject related to the rose, presented by a recognized authority. Division I Show Rules

1. Entries will be received from 6:00 am until 9:30 am, Saturday, May 1, 2010. No entries taken after 9:30 am.
2. Judging will be in accordance with current *Guidelines for Judging Roses*. The judges decisions are final.
3. Roses to be grown in the exhibitor's outdoor, private garden.
4. Horticulture Judges and members of their families may not enter specimens, with the exception of Section M-Judges Entries.
5. Classification of roses will be in accordance with the latest edition of *Modern Roses Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Judges, Exhibitors Handbook for Selecting Roses, Combined Rose List*, or the New Rose Registration in the American Rose. Roses must be exhibited under the ARS Exhibition names as listed in bold type in the *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses*. ARS publications take priority over *Combined Rose List*.
6. This is an alphabetically arranged show--each variety constituting a separate class.
7. Exhibitors may make only one entry of the variety in a section. **DUPLICATE ENTRIES WILL DISQUALIFY BOTH.**
8. Only Large-flowered Climbers (LCI), Hybrid Wichurana (HWich) and Hybrid Giganteas (HGig) are to be exhibited in Class 13. All other climbers must be exhibited in the same class as their bush counterparts (HT, F, Min, T, etc.)
9. Each exhibitor must be registered and use ONLY official ARS entry tags. Complete ONLY the upper half of the tag including name and address. Use blue or black pen. (No felt tips please.) No exhibitor numbers needed.
10. Wedging may be used. If wedging material protrudes above the lip of the vase, the specimen will be penalized. Wedging must allow the addition of water to the exhibit.
11. ARS rules governing disqualification will be strictly adhered to including misnamed, misplaced, misclassified, mislabeled or unlabeled, stem-on-stem (except old garden roses and shrubs), side buds, presence of a foreign substance, entries in violation of ARS or show rules, or without an approved exhibition name.
12. The placement committee will place all roses except for challenge classes. No unauthorized people in the show area.
13. All exhibits become property of CCRS.
14. Trophies will be awarded at 2:00 pm on Saturday, May 1, 2010. Winners should be present to accept awards. Exhibitors wishing to have ribbons must pick them up on May 1, 2010. **RIBBONS WILL NOT BE MAILED.**
15. Sect. K, Classes 50 - 52 are open only to members of CCRS.
16. Any exhibit with more than one stem must be arranged by the exhibitor. **ALL EXHIBITS MUST REPRESENT ONLY THE EXHIBITOR'S WORK.**

Division I - Horticulture

Section A - Hybrid Teas & Grandifloras

- Class 1 One bloom per stem.** Exhibition Form.
Queen of Show - ARS Gold Certificate & Trophy
King of Show - ARS Silver Certificate & Trophy
Princess of Show - ARS Bronze Certificate & Trophy
- Class 2 Three Blooms** - Exhibition form without sidebuds; one variety, one container. Award: Trophy
- Class 3 Six Blooms** - Exhibition form without sidebuds; one variety, one container. Trophy
- Class 4 One Spray** - Must have two or more blooms. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 5 One Decorative Form Bloom** - Without sidebuds. Trophy (This class is for varieties without exhibition form. Varieties that can have exhibition form will be disqualified.)
- Class 6 Single Petaled Bloom (4-8 petals)** - One bloom or spray, one stem. Trophy
- Class 7 Fully Open Bloom** - One bloom without sidebuds. Stamens should show. Trophy & ARS Certificate

Section B - Floribundas & Polyanthas

- Class 8 One FL Bloom** - One bloom without sidebuds. 9 or more petals. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 9 One FL Spray** - Two or more blooms. 9+ petals.
Floribunda Queen of Show - Gold Cert. & Trophy
Floribunda King of Show - Silver Cert. & Trophy
Floribunda Princess of Show - Bronze Cert. & Trophy
- Class 10 Three FL Sprays** - One or more varieties. 1 vase. Trophy
- Class 11 One Polyantha Spray** - Two or more blooms. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 12 Floribunda-Single** - One bloom or spray 4-8 petals (or classified as a single by Modern Roses 12). One stem. Trophy & ARS Certificate

Section C - Large Flowered Climber & Shrubs

- Class 13 Climber** - Includes Large Flowered Climbers, Hybrid Wichuranas or Hybrid Gigantea. One bloom or spray without sidebuds. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 14 Classic Shrub** - One bloom or spray. Hybrid Rugosa, Hybrid Musk, Hybrid Kordeesii, or Hybrid Moyessii. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 15 Modern Shrub** - One bloom, shown with or w/o sidebuds. Roses listed as 'S' in ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 16 Modern Shrub Spray** - One spray with two or more blooms. Roses listed as 'S' in ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. Trophy
- Class 17 Shrub Bouquet** - One or more Classic or Modern Shrub varieties, 9 stems or more. Grown & arranged by exhibitor. Exhibitor furnished container. Trophy

Section D - Old Garden Roses

(Write introduction date on entry tag. If date is unknown, write 'Date Unknown' on the tag as per Modern Roses XI.)

- Class 18 Genesis** - One bloom or spray of any type old garden rose designated as 'Sp' Species in ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 19 Dowager** - One bloom or spray of any variety of rose in existence prior to 1867. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 20 Victorian** - One bloom or spray introduced in 1867 or after. Trophy & ARS Certificate
- Class 21 Bouquet** - Any type of Old Garden Rose, one or more varieties, 9 or more blooms or sprays, grown & arranged by exhibitor. Exhibitor furnishes container. Trophy

Section E - Novice

(Restricted to persons who have not won more than three blue ribbons or a trophy in an ARS Rose Show prior to this year.)

All Classes will receive a trophy and an ARS Certificate.

- Class 22 One Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Bloom** - Exhibition form without sidebuds.
- Class 23 Floribunda and Polyanthas** - One bloom or spray.
- Class 24 Climbers and Shrubs** - One bloom or spray.
- Class 25 Old Garden Rose** - Write date of introduction on entry tag if known. If unknown, write 'Date Unknown' on tag.
- Class 26 Mini or Mini-Flora** - One bloom or spray.

Section F - Miscellaneous

- Class 27 Most Fragrant HT, GR, FL Rose** - One bloom. 70% fragrance-30% general excellence. Trophy & ARS Cert.
- Class 28 Most Fragrant OGR or Shrub Rose** - One bloom. 70% fragrance-30% general excellence. Trophy & ARS Cert.
- Class 29 Rose in a Bowl** - Any type except mini or miniflora. **One entry/exhibitor.** Floating bloom in clear water, no foliage. Society furnishes bowls. Trophy & ARS Cert.

Class 30 Rose in a Picture Frame - Any variety, except mini or mini-floras. One or more blooms, foliage optional. One entry/exhibitor. Society furnishes frames. *Trophy*

Class 31 Artist's Palette - Any type or types of roses using five different color classes. With or without sepals, NO FOLIAGE. Society furnishes palettes. No Mini or Mini-Floras. List roses on back of entry tag. *Trophy*

Class 32 Cycle of Bloom - One variety, any type. Three stems: one fully open, one ½ to ¾ open and one bud showing color with sepals down. One bloom per stem without side buds in one container. *Trophy*

Class 33 Big and Little Look Alike - One large bloom (any type) and one miniature or miniflora bloom, in separate vases. *Except for size, roses must look similar. Trophy & ARS Cert.*

Section G - English Boxes

(English boxes provided. Limit one entry /exhibitor per class.)

Class 34 Exhibitor's Choice - Six blooms of one variety, with no stem or foliage. May be shown with or without sepals. No Mini or Mini-Floras *Trophy & ARS Certificate*

Class 35 Variety Box - Six blooms, three or more varieties, no stem or foliage. May be shown with or w/o sepals. *Trophy*

Section H - Miniature Roses

Class 36 One bloom per stem. Exhibition Form. No sidebuds.
Mini Queen of Show - *Gold Cert. & Trophy*
Mini King of Show - *Silver Cert. & Trophy*
Mini Princess of Show - *Bronze Cert. & Trophy*

Section I - Miniflora Roses

Class 37 One bloom per stem. Exhibition Form. No sidebuds.
Miniflora Queen of Show - *Gold Cert. & Trophy*
Miniflora King of Show - *Silver Cert. & Trophy*
Miniflora Princess of Show - *Bronze Cert. & Trophy*

Section J - Mini & Minifloras

Class 38 Three Blooms - One variety, without sidebuds, any form, in one container. *Trophy*

Class 39 Six Blooms - One variety, without sidebuds, any form, in one container. *Trophy*

Class 40 One Spray - One stem with two or more blooms. *Trophy & ARS Certificate*

Class 42 Three Sprays - One variety with two or more blooms per stem, shown in one vase. No 4-8 petal blooms. *Trophy*

Class 42 Fully Open - One bloom shown without sidebuds, stamens must be showing. No single (4-8 petals) varieties. *Trophy & ARS Certificate*

Class 43 Single Petaled Bloom - 4-8 petals without sidebuds. *Trophy & ARS Certificate*

Class 44 Cycle of Bloom - One variety, mini or miniflora. Three stems: one fully open, one ½ to ¾ open and one bud showing color with sepals down. One bloom per stem w/o side buds in one container. *Trophy*

Class 45 Mini or Miniflora Rose in a Champagne Glass Rose floating in clear water. No foliage. Society furnishes glass. One entry/exhibitor. *Trophy & ARS Certificate*

Class 46 Mini or Miniflora in a Picture Frame - One or more blooms, foliage optional. One entry per exhibitor. Frames furnished by society. *Trophy*

Class 47 Miniature Artist's Palette Five different Mini or Minifloras using five different color classes. No stem or foliage, with or without sepals. Palettes furnished by society. List roses on back of entry tag. *Trophy*

Class 48 Mini or Miniflora English Box - Six blooms, one or more varieties, no stem or foliage. May be shown with or w/o sepals. *Trophy & ARS Certificate*

Class 49 "Micro Minis are Roses too" - Minimum three blooms of a micro miniature rose (singles or spray), may mix varieties in one vase provided by exhibitor. *Trophy*

Section K - Challenge Classes

Each entry is judged using the standards appropriate for the type of rose, flower form, and stage of bloom appropriate for the entry. 100 possible points, the prime elements = 80% of the score and Overall appearance = 20% of the overall score.

(Class 50-52 - CCRS members ONLY. One entry per exhibitor.)

Class 50 President's Trophy - Any multi-color rose, bi-color or blend, any variety. *Trophy*

Class 51 Founder's Trophy - Six HTs in one container in any combination of yellow and red. *Trophy*

Class 52 Gwen Cleary Memorial Trophy - OGR Roses. Three stems of pink or white in any combination. Show in one container provided by society. *Trophy donated by Gwen Cleary Memorial Gift to CCRS.*

(Class 54-57 are open to everyone.)

Class 53 Del Mar Rose Society Trophy - 3-5 stems of David Austin Roses. Sprays or stems in one vase. *Trophy*

Class 54 Grand Canyon Suite - 5 different varieties HTs and/or GRs, displayed in one container. Roses from color classes yellow, red, orange or blends of same and orange-pink, including Gemini, to highlight colors of the Southwest. Judged 70% form & 30% blend of colors. *Trophy*

Class 55 Rose Angel - Roses that did not make it to the other classes arranged in a disposable non returnable container, i.e. milk carton, coffee can, etc. Roses will be donated to a local Hospice Center. Thank You! *Trophy*

Section L - Rose Photography

All photographs are to be mounted and matted. Outside dimensions of the mat are to be approximately 14" x 11" (35-36 cms x 27-28 cms). Orientation may be landscape or portrait. Color of the mat is at the discretion of the exhibitor. Photographs may be no smaller than approximately 5" x 7" (12 cms x 17 cms) and no larger than approximately 8" x 10" (20 cms x 26 cms). Exhibitors are limited to one entry in each sub class.

Class 56 One bloom, at its most perfect stage. Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora or Floribunda, no sidebuds. *Trophy*

Class 57 One spray (2 or more blooms). Hybrid Tea, - Grandiflora, Floribunda or Polyantha. *Trophy*

Class 58 One bloom or spray (any type rose). S tamens must show. *Trophy*

Class 59 One bloom or spray of an Old Garden rose, Shrub or Climber. *Trophy*

Class 60 One bloom (no sidebuds) or spray of a Miniature or Miniflora rose. *Trophy*

Class 61 A photo of a person/people and/or animal with a rose or roses. Garden shots are acceptable. *Trophy*

Class 62 Abstract or Impressionism - Photo of a rose plant(s) or any portion thereof having non-objective design, form or content. Does not include abstract arrangements. *Trophy*
